



**PROGRAM OF SARAJEVO OPEN CENTRE ON THE OCCASION OF 16 DAYS OF  
ACTIVISM AGAINST GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE AND 10 DECEMBER,  
INTERNATIONAL HUMAN RIGHTS DAY 2017**

During the last twenty-four years, the global 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-based Violence Campaign has been dedicated to advocacy and coordinating the work of support to ending gender-based violence on local and international level. The Campaign was launched on the first Institute for Global Women Leaders that was organized by the Center for Global Women's Leadership in 1991 on Rutgers University.

The dates 25 November (International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women) and 10 December (Human Rights Day) were chosen in order to emphasize the connection between gender-based violence and the values of human rights, and it was highlighted that gender-based violence is one of the international human rights violations. This 16-day period also emphasizes other important dates, including 29 November, International Human Rights Defenders Day, 1 December, World AIDS Day, 6 December, the day that marks the Montreal massacre (in Canada - The National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence Against Women, also known as The White Ribbon Day).

The participants of the 16 Days of Activism Campaign include individuals and groups all around the world, and use the human rights framework in advocating for the elimination of all forms of violence against women through awareness-raising activities on local, state, regional and international levels.

Sarajevo Open Centre, as the organization that advocates full respect of human rights and social inclusion of LGBTI (lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans\* and intersex) persons and women, joins this campaign, and will implement a number of activities in November and December of 2017.

**The last year was marked by the repression and police brutality towards women – workers who only sought out their rights by using legal remedies – strike and protests. We condemn violence that these women suffered and stand resolutely with the workers of Fortuna, Borac, as well as with the courageous women of Kruščica. No one is free until we are all free!**

It happens at school, on the street, at work, in the public city transport, at home, during concerts, in the theatre.</p> <p>Therefore, when someone on the street tells us “You’re so hot”, that is not a compliment, that evokes fear, humiliation and discomfort in women. When someone derives conclusions based on our appearances, we are feared of the actions that may follow.</p> <p>When in public city transport our bodies are touched, we feel humiliated and upset.</p> <p>These are some of the many forms of sexual harassment. <p>29 Nov 2017 12 P.M.</p>	<p><b>ROUNDTABLE</b> <b>To Act Together – How to achieve higher participation of women in the executive in BiH</b></p> <p>Almost fifteen years since the adoption of the Gender Equality Law in BiH that requires the obligatory minimum representation of both sexes in the bodies of the executive, legislative and judicial branch of government, with 40%, the representation of women in the executive bodies in BiH in barely 20%. The equal representation of both sexes in political life, on the most important positions is the key for the equality of men and women in all other aspects of life. We will work with the representatives of the state, entities and cantonal assemblies on finding the solution to this problem. <p>28 Nov 2017 11:05 A.M.</p>	<p><b>RADIO SHOW</b> <b>Žene u političkom životu u BiH</b></p> <p>In 2016, there were Local Elections in BiH, the percentage of women elected, though a little higher, has been the highest so far – the average percentage of the mandates won, of women's participation in municipality/city councils, is 18,34%. In four municipalities no woman has been elected, and only in one municipality women have reached 54,55%, out of 11 elected councilors, 6 of them are women (Municipality Kupres, Republika Srpska).</p> <p>What do these statistics tell us? They show that, even though the Law on Gender Equality requires minimum 40% of political representation of women on all authority levels, that is not the case this time, same as we have not reached that percentage on any of the general, nor local elections in BiH so far. In the previous ten years we have not significantly moved from the 20% of women's representation in the legislative bodies on state, entities, cantonal and local levels.
